





International Bowling Museum & Hall Of Fame



Funded by the City of Reno Arts & Culture Commission, Reno artist Eileen Gay created the 700-pound sculpture, Pin Setting, in less than four months. Gay worked seven days a week for the last two months of the project, constructing the eight-foot pin, perfecting the bowling ball which is five-feet in diameter and covering approximately 120-sqaure-feet of space with detailed mosaic. Pin Setting puts the final permanent touch on Reno's International Bowling Museum & Hall of Fame.

USA, Canada Take Masters Golds At **PABCON Championships**



HENDERSON, Nev. -USA's Shannon Pluhowsky and Canada's George Lambert earned the gold medals Saturday in Masters match play to close out the 2012 Pan American Bowling Confederation Adult Championships.

Pluhowsky defeated teammate Liz Johnson, 238-226, to win the women's title, while Lambert fired a perfect game in defeating Puerto

The Masters gold capped off a successful week for Team USA as it took eight gold

medals, six silver medals and three bronze medals.

The United States hopes to carry that success forward to next year's World Tenpin Bowling Association World Championships, which will be held in the same venue in

"To come out here and do so well as a team really gives us some momentum going into the World Championships," Pluhowsky said. "We have to try and defend our home turf next year, and that will be a challenge, but this was good preparation for it."

In the women's semifinals, Pluhowsky took down Colombia's Clara Guerrero, 234-213, while Johnson defeated teammate Josie Earnest, 216-214. Guerrero and Earnest each earned a bronze medal

Lambert delivered 12 perfect strikes in claiming the men's Masters gold medal for the Canadians, who also won the men's trios gold medal this week.

"After the seventh and eighth strikes, I knew I had a good lead to win the match," Lambert said. "It seemed the job was done, and the 300 was just the icing on the

Lambert won his semifinal match against top seed Tommy Jones of the United States, 226-197, while Colon took down Team USA's Bill O'Neill, 204-202. Jones and O'Neill each earned a bronze medal.

Big Finish Gives Rash West Region Chameleon Title

Sean Rash of Montgomery, III., rolled games of 279 and 300 in his final two matches to win the PBA West/ Northwest Region Chameleon Don Johnson Memorial presented by Brunswick at 4th Street Bowl in San Jose, Calif., on Sunday, Sept. 2, by 69 pins over Jeff Frankos of Daly City, Calif.

Rash, who earned \$2,500 along with his seventh PBA Regional title, used his big finish to post a 5-7 match play record and a 20-game total of 4,887 pins, including match play bonus pins. Frankos had a 9-3 match play record and 4,818 pins.

The tournament was the West Region's fourth and final "animal pattern" championship event. Rash earned a paid entry into the 2012 PBA World Series of Bowling as the highest finisher in the optional animal pattern entry program while Frankos secured a WSOB entry as the overall points leader for the four West Region events.

In the companion Senior Open, Ron Mohr of Eagle River, Alaska, went 4-4 and knocked down 3,711 total pins for 16 games to top Hugh Miller of Mercer Island, Wash., for his seventh West Regional senior title and \$1,500.

• In the Southwest Region's annual trek to Golden, Colo., Nathan Bohr of Wichita, Kan., won five of his eight matches and dominated the third annual Miller/Coors Golden Bowl Open presented by Roto Grip at Golden Bowl on Sunday. The win was Bohr's 14th in PBA Regional competition and third of the summer season.

Bohr, who barely made it out of qualifying, securing the eighth and last spot in the match play finals field, fired back-to-back games of 279 and 245 to break up a heated contest after four match games. Amateur Steve Badovinac of Parker, Colo., defeated Ben Laughlin of Chandler, Ariz., 246-213, in the position round to vault over Henderson, Nev.'s Dave Wodka for second place.

• In Vero Beach, Fla., Rhino Page of Dade City, Fla., won three straight matches including a 207-157 victory over top qualifier Dale Coleman of High Springs, Fla., to win the PBA South Region Vero Beach Open at Vero Bowl on Monday, Sept. 3.

Page collected his sixth PBA Regional title and \$3,400 after nipping PBA Hall of Famer Walter Ray Williams Jr. of Ocala, Fla., in his first match, 219-215 (in a contest that saw both players leave pocket 7-10s in the 10th frame), followed by a 234-238 win over Scott Newell of Deland , Fla., 234-228, in the semi-final match to ad-

• In Pottsville, Pa., Jeff Zaffino of Warren, Pa., collected his milestone 20th career regional title when he defeated Bob Caruso of Dayton, N.J., 205-193, in the PBA East Region Strike Zone Senior Open presented by Etonic at Strike Zone Alleys on Sunday.

Zaffino, who regularly competes in both the East and Central Region events, has now advanced to the finals in each of the seven East Region senior events he has entered since turning 50 in 2009. Sunday's win, which paid \$1,500, was his fourth of the current season.

A heavy schedule of regional activity continues throughout September. Over the Sept. 7-9 weekend, the South Region will host its third annual Fran Bohlman Memorial Open at Avalon Bowling Center in Milton, Fla.; the Central Region will conduct its second annual G.A. Wintzer & Son Classic presented by Roto Grip at Astro Lanes in Wapakoneta, Ohio; the East Region will conduct the Howell (N.J.) Lanes Senior Open; the Southwest Region offers the Storm Texas Senior Open at AMF Euless Lanes; and the Midwest Region will conduct standard and senior events at its Thunderbowl Open in Council Bluffs, Iowa.

The Sept. 14-16 weekend includes the South Region's Red Zone Lounge Open at Thunder Alley in Covington, Va., and the Southwest Region will conduct the Fort Smith (Ark.) Open presented by Storm at Bowling World.

The Sept. 21-23 schedule features the Southwest Region's Odessa (Texas) Challenge for non-champions at Astro Bowl; the Central and Midwest Regions will combine for the Mel Westrich Senior Open at Delphos (Ohio) Recreation Center; the South Region will host the Victory Lanes Senior Open in Mooresville, N.C.; and the Northwest/West Regions will join hands for the Ten Down Lanes Open presented by Track in Roseburg, Ore.

Closing out the month, the Sept. 29-30 schedule features the West/Northwest Regions' Sands Regency Casino Open and non-champions events at the National Bowling Stadium in Reno; the Central, East and South Regions will combine for the Roger Boone Memorial Senior Classic presented by Fritz's Pharmacy at Greenbreier Bowling Center in Lewisburg, W.Va.; and the Midwest Region will host standard and senior St. Clair Bowl events sponsored by Allstate Insurance in Fairview Heights, III.

The tournament was hosted by Reno's Tri Properties (Eldorado, Circus Circus and Silver Legacy) in cooperation with the PBA Northwest Region. PBA covered the event, live on its Xtra Frame online bowling channel.
- Four-time PBA Tour titlist and reigning USBC Masters champion Mike Fagan says, via Twitter: If you are a competitive bowler and you don't bowl the WSOB you have to be crazy. \$600,000 in prizes for \$750 entry.
- When do you have to throw 13 strikes for a 300 game? When you start the game on the wrong lane, and have to throw the shot over...which is what Sean Rash did in his final game in the PBA West/Northwest Region Chameleon Don Johnson Memorial presented by Brunswick at 4th Street Bowl in San Jose, Calif., Sunday. Rash's perfect finish gave him a 69-pin victory over Jeff Frankos of Daly City, Calif.

In addition, Behrendt is preparing for the Mini Eliminator in Las Vegas, Nev., in February. He concedes that the high number of bowling events in the St. Louis area will keep him busy and allow him plenty of opportunity for more success.

"Tim did a great job at the Petersen this year, and we're so proud that Ebonite could be a part of that success," said Ed Gallagher, Ebonite Brand Manager. "He overcame a great deal of pressure to succeed in such tough conditions. He's going to be tough to beat in his future competitions, and we can't wait to see what he wins next."

Idle Bowling Thoughts

Tournament, tournaments.

Bowling wouldn't be the same without them. They're the icing on the bowling cake. Each year there are some 10,000 tournaments, give or take a few hundred. They offer prizes ranging from tiny trophies to more than \$200,000 if you shoot the right game in the right place at the right time.

They go in distance from a single ball to as many games as you can roll in days. They're conducted at any and all hours and there probably isn't any time of the year, any year, when a bowling tournament isn't being conducted somewhere in this rapidly shrinking world.

Why should you bowl in a tournament? If you enjoy bowling, you're competitive to a degree. League bowling is more competitive than open bowling and tournaments are just another extension into another field of competition.

If you look at tournament bowling as a way to quick riches, forget it. Sure there are winners, big winners. But look at the prize ratios, one winner for every so many entries, meaning for every winner there must be multiple los-

But that's talking money. There's plenty of experience, satisfaction and competitive fun in tournaments, rewards not as obvious as money. Only your check book can tell you what you can afford in the way of tournament play. Once it tells you how far you can go or how near you must stay, the next step is to check out what is available. That information is usually as close as your nearest bowling center of bowling paper, and often your mailbox brings you news of the tournament goodies available.

There is a tournament for you, no matter what your age, size, sex, average or what. The good tournament promoters verge on genius. You can win money, cars, trips, merchandise of all sorts.

A word of caution. Most tournaments are conducted well, and a boost to all tournaments is to gain the help of the United States Bowling Congress sanction to insure the honesty of the event.

But there are many grabbers, interested in themselves first, and one of their chief delights is to con people. And bowlers are people, and they can be conned, simply because they don't take the time to read or count or add.

Check the entry blanks. See the breakdown or the entry fee. Part of the fee pays for the bowling, some goes for scoring, and it's necessary that a fair amount be deducted to pay for the many other expenses. That is all fine, within reason. Be wary of too much being taken from the entry fee, or too little. Always remember, with the exception of some specialized commercially sponsored tournaments, you're not going to get something for nothing.

So if you're paying, get the most for your money. It's not as difficult as you might think. The same way a housewife shops for groceries and other needs, a bowler should shop for tournaments.

A bowler who doesn't compete in tournaments is missing a good part of the sport. Every bowler should go out of his way to support his local and state association events

If you haven't been bowling in tournaments, toss away all the excuses and give a couple a try. If you have been rolling in tournaments, you don't have to be sold the benefits, only the cautions.

As they say at most events, good luck and good bowling.

Amleto Monacelli Selected As 2012 PBA Senior Rookie Of The Year

Dave Soutar caps career as Dick Weber Sportsmanship Award winner

SEATTLE -- Professional Bowlers Association Hall of Famer Amleto Monacelli, a twotime Player of the Year on the PBA Tour, was selected as the 2012 PBA Senior Rookie of the Year, becoming the first international player to earn the award.

The 51-year-old native of Venezuela also became the first international player to win the Etonic Senior U.S. Open last June when he defeated fellow Hall of Famer and 2012 Senior Player of the Year Walter Ray Williams Jr., 255-247, in the championship match at the Suncoast Bowling Center in Las Vegas.

He also finished third in the United States Bowling Congress Senior Masters and compiled four other top 20 finishes which included a 10th, 11th, 15th and 19th in his six Senior Tour appearances

"I quickly found that you still have to be bowling at a top level to do well on the Senior Tour," said Monacelli. "The competition was very tough and I feel fortunate to do as well I did in my first year."

During his career on the PBA Tour, Monacelli won 19 titles and was the first foreign-born player to win PBA Player of the Year earning the honor back-to-back in 1989 and 1990. He is the only foreign-born member of the PBA Hall of Fame and was inducted into the USBC Hall of Fame in 2012.

"One of my first impressions of bowling on the Senior Tour was how fast time has gone by," he added. "Bowling with some of the guys I bowled against on Tour brought back a lot of memories."

Also receiving votes for Senior Rookie of the Year were Bob Learn Jr., Mike Edwards and Lennie Boresch who each won one title during the season, and Bryan Goebel, Rick Minier, Paul McCordic, Joel Carlson, Brian Cooper, Randy Shewmake and Todd Kjell.

Hall of Famer Dave Soutar of Bradenton, Fla., who retired after more than 50 years of competing on the PBA Tour and Senior Tour, was voted the winner of the Senior Tour's Dick Weber Sportsmanship Award.

In a career that started in 1961, Soutar won 18 titles on the PBA Tour and seven on the Senior Tour and becomes the first player to win sportsmanship awards from both Tours. He earned the PBA Tour's Steve Nagy Sportsmanship Award winner in 1970.

"I've always respected my competitors and felt that if someone beat me they bowled better than I did and they did the job they were supposed to do," said the 72-year-old Soutar, who bowled in a record 259 Senior Tour tournaments. "I've always been pretty low key. If I got beat or wasn't bowling well I usually directed my anger at myself and not my opponents."

The Senior Rookie of the Year award was voted on by PBA members and selected bowling writers while the Sportsmanship award was voted on by Senior Tour players.

Williams Wins, But Doyle Adds To Youthful Résumé

Newly-crowned PBA Senior Player of the Year Walter Ray Williams Jr. of Ocala, Fla., won Sunday's PBA South Region Scorpion Open at Cherokee Lanes in Canton, Ga., but it was 14-year-old amateur Kamron Doyle of Brentwood, Tenn., who continued to dazzle the bowling world with another eye-opening performance.

Williams, 52, defeated Dick Allen of Columbia, S.C., 255-172, to win the final South Region animal pattern championship of the season. It was Williams' 31st standard PBA Regional title and 85th overall PBA title (47 PBA Tour, four Senior Tour and three Senior Regional titles). He advanced to the title match after eliminating Doyle in the semifinal round, 226-214.

Doyle's third-place finish was his highest ever in PBA competition, but not his first sterling performance. In 2010, also in Canton, Doyle became the youngest player in PBA history to "cash" in a regional tournament when he finished 30th in an event also won by Williams. Earlier in 2012, Doyle became the youngest player ever (also at age 14) to cash in the U.S. Open, finished 61st in a world-class field of professional and amateur bowlers in North Brunswick, N.J.

As an amateur, Doyle is not allowed to accept money, but his earnings are deposited into his growing USBC SMART scholarship account.

For the record, the youngest bowler ever to win a PBA Regional title was Pete Weber, who won a PBA Midwest Regional tournament in St. Louis at age 17. Doyle is the youngest ever to finish as high a third place. In April, Wesley Low of Palmdale, Calif., also finished third in a PBA West Region non-champions tournament at the age of 14 years, 344 days. Low is 126 days older than Doyle.

Mike Williams II of Montgomery, Ala., won the South Region's Scorpion Open entry into PBA World Series of Bowling IV as the highest finisher in the optional animal pattern entry program because Williams had won an entry in a previous event. Jason Sterner of Riverdale, Ga., also won a World Series entry as the East Region's overall points leader in the fourth animal pattern events.

The South Region's Viper Open winner was Zach Brown, Raleigh, N.C.; Rhino Page of Dade City, Fla., won the Chameleon Open and amateur Jason Mahr of Spring Hills, Fla., was the Cheetah Open winner.

• In the PBA Southwest Region, Nathan Bohr of Derby, Kan., defeated Dino Castillo of Carrollton, Texas, 199-194, to win his 13th regional title Sunday in the Greenville (Texas) Scorpion Open presented by DV8 at DB's Sports Grill & Bowl.

Both players earned paid entries into the 2012 PBA World Series of Bowling in the Southwest Region's fourth and final animal pattern championship event. Castillo was the highest finisher in the optional animal pattern entry program while Bohr won his WSOB berth as the overall points leader in the region's four animal pattern tournaments.

Earlier in the season, Chris Hibbitts II of Fort Worth, Texas, won the Southwest Region's Viper Open while PBA Tour veteran Mike Scroggins of Amarillo, Texas, won both the Cheetah Open and Chameleon Open titles.

• In the PBA Midwest Region, Dave Traber of Hebron, III., defeated Jeff Richgels of Madison, Wis., 216-215, to win the Premiere Bowling & Entertainment Center Cheetah Open presented by Brunswick in Pleasant Hill, Iowa, on Sunday

The title, in the fourth of the Midwest Region's four

"animal pattern" championship tournaments, included a \$2,500 prize. It was Traber's 29th career regional title and his second straight animal pattern win. He also won the Illinois Valley Viper Classic in late July.

Eugene McCune of Munster, Ind., who finished third, earned a paid entry into the 2012 PBA World Series of Bowling as the highest finisher in the optional animal pattern entry competition. Traber's victory also earned him a WSOB entry as the winner of the four-tournament animal pattern points competition.

Earlier in the season, Jason Wojnar of Chicago won the Midwest Region's Scorpion Open and PBA Hall of Famer Pete Weber won the Chameleon Open.

• In the PBA East Region, Ryan Shafer of Horseheads, N.Y., defeated amateur Robert Smith of Voorhees, N.J., 182-173, to win the Mil-Ray Foods Open at 30 Strikes in Stratford, N.J., on Sunday. Shafer successfully defended his 2011 Mil-Ray Foods title, earning \$2,500 and his 19th career regional title, when Smith - bowling in his first PBA Regional event – failed to double in the 10th frame.

Other Labor Day weekend events include the PBA East Region Strike Zone Senior Open in Pottsville, Pa.; the PBA South Region Vero Bowl Classic in Vero Beach, Fla., and the PBA Southwest Region Miller/Coors Open presented by Roto Grip at Golden Bowl in Golden, Colo.

Team USA's women, including PBA member Liz Johnson, former PBA Women's Series competitors Stefanie Nation, Diandra Asbaty and Shannon Pluhowsky; hall of famer Leanne Hulsenberg, and amateur Josie Earnest, gave the United States a sweep in the team competitions. Pluhowsky also won gold in the women's Masters (defeating Johnson, 238-226, in the final match) and trios (with Johnson and Nation). Johnson won the women's allevents title.

PBA Hall Of Famer Pete Weber Set To Join PBA50 Tour In 2013

PBA Hall of Famer Pete Weber of St. Ann, Mo., is ready to join the PBA50 Tour after celebrating his 50th birthday on Tuesday, Aug. 21.

Weber, the winner of 35 PBA Tour titles (fourth on the all -time list) and a record 47 PBA Regional titles, is the only player in history to win five U.S. Open titles. He has bowled in 726 PBA Tour tournaments in a career that began at age 17 in 1979 – when he became the youngest player ever to win a PBA Regional title (St. Louis, 1979). He also is the youngest United States Bowling Congress member to bowl a 300 game in his first game as a certified adult league bowler, a feat he accomplished at age 15 in St. Louis.

Weber, who will begin his 34th season as a PBA Tour competitor when PBA World Series of Bowling IV gets underway Nov. 2-11 in Las Vegas, is expected to make his debut on the newly-renamed PBA50 Tour (formerly PBA Senior Tour) in the spring of 2013. Next year's PBA50 Tour schedule will be announced later in the fall. The PBA's 50-and-older players have completed their 2012 season.



Helen Duval's Bowling Tips

Bad Hand Position—Bad Delivery

Are you approaching the ball return properly, facing the pins? Are you checking on either side of your lane so as not to interfere with others? Are you checking the sole of your sliding show on the approach **before** making your delivery?

Now you're ready to pick up your ball. Do you realize that if you pick up the ball the wrong way, chances are you will deliver it wrong, too?

Let's be honest. Do you pick up the ball from the ball return with one hand? Here's what can happen if you do.

You may get your fingers mashed between two balls, perhaps meaning no bowling for a while. Or you could jam your fingers in the holes.

If you pick up the ball with one hand throughout three games, your hand and arm will become so tired that your effectiveness will be reduced. And you might think that's a reason to purchase a lighter ball.

Picking up the ball with one hand means you will have a tendency to deliver the ball with both fingers and the thumb and that's bad, too.

Let's correct these faults and concentrate on the better way to pick up your ball.

Instructors all over the country will tell you to "pick up the ball with **both** hands." Here are four reasons why:

You aren't as likely to be injured.

You distribute the weight of the ball on both hands and arms.

You'll be more likely to place your fingers in the finger holes correctly when the time comes.

Your fingers won't become moist, thereby causing a slippery delivery. Leaving your fingers in the ball's holes too long often causes perspiration to form on them.

So now you're ready to pick up the ball and take your position to bowl.

Pick up the ball from the return with both hands, one on either side of the ball toward the



outside of the return. Take your proper spot on the approach, still holding your ball with both hands.

After you have found your starting spot on the approach, put your two bowling fingers in the ball holes and **then** the thumb. Whatever your ball's grip—conventional, semi or finger-tip—always have enough spread so that **all** of your thumb goes down into the thumb hole.

Your thumb hole should be slightly loose and by all means not tight. If you are not sure about the fit, rotate **just** the thumb quickly in the hole. Don't have it so snug that the flesh is twisted during the rotation. The fingers can fit on the snug side, thereby enabling you to lift the ball in the delivery over the foul line.

After your two fingers and then your thumb are in the holes, **look** at your hand. It should be in the handshake position, and there should be no wrinkles on the wrist. Support the ball with your non-bowling hand.

Consider these statistics: If you roll 20 balls a game, in three games you will have lifted the ball 60 times. If your ball weighs 16 pounds, that's the equivalent of lifting 960 pounds in the span of two or three hours. That's nearly half a ton of dead weight. No wonder you are tired or want to purchase a lighter ball if you're lifting it with one hand.

Team USA Sweeps Team, All-Events Golds At PABCON Championships

HENDERSON, Nev. - The Team USA men and women swept the gold medals in team and all-events Friday at the 2012 Pan American Bowling Confederation Adult Championships.

The U.S. women broke the PABCON Championships record for six -game team total with 6,713 as they rolled to the gold medal by 256 pins over Mexico at Sunset Station's Strike Zone Bowling Center. The Team USA men shot 6,687 and finished 194 pins ahead of Mexico.

The United States was led in the women's event by all-events gold medalist Liz Johnson with 1,473 and she was joined by Stefanie Nation (1,337), Josie Earnest (1,284), Diandra Asbaty (1,217), Shannon Pluhowsky (709) and Leanne Hulsenberg (693).

"We accomplished our goals, which was to go for the team gold and the trios gold," said Johnson, who won the all-events with a 24-game total of 5,427 (226.1 average). "We all worked together really well. There were some moves we had to make during team and everyone worked very well with each other."

Mexico took the women's silver medal with 6,457, while Colombia earned the bronze with 6,176. In all-events, Nation finished with the silver with 5,316, while Colombia's Rocio Restrepo took the bronze with 5,287.

On the men's side, Team USA was led by Tommy Jones with 1,376 and was followed by all-events gold medalist Bill O'Neill (1,354), Steve Smith (1,311), Marshall Kent (1,269), Patrick Allen (692) and John Janawicz (685).

"We had an unexpected lead coming into the day and we all worked really, really well together all day," said O'Neill, who won allevents with 5,556 (231.5 average). "It's a lot harder than it used to be to win because the talent level is so much better. To have so many teams competing for medals is pretty cool to see."

Mexico rallied in the final two games to take the silver medal with 6,493, while the Dominican Republic won its first men's medal since 1989 by finishing third with 6,484. In all-events, Jones claimed the silver with 5,543, while Puerto Rico's Francisco Colon took the bronze with 5,504.

The top 24 men and top 24 women in the all-events standings after 24 games advanced to Saturday's Masters competition. All 12 Team USA players advanced.

The remaining players will bowl six games Saturday morning before the field is cut to the top eight in each division for round robin match play. After 37 total games, including match play bonus pins, the top four men and top four women will advance to the semifinals.



Teen Overcomes Impediment Through Bowling



The summer heat in Texas is known for many things; changing people's lives for the better is not among them. Yet that is exactly what it did for Weatherford, Texas, youthbowler, Matthew Becker.

"The first time I went bowling, it was like 110 degrees one day and my grandma didn't want to go out to Putt-Putt or somewhere like that," Matthew, now 17, recalls. "So she said 'Why don't we go bowling?' And I just loved it from the first day."

Matthew did not know it then, but the day he stepped into that bowling center for some fun away from the sun was his first step away from his fear of ridicule.

Matthew was just like any other kid looking for something to do on a summer day. There was only one thing that made him a little different: Speech did not come as easily to Matthew as it did to most kids. Back then, he was as likely to stutter as he was to express himself clearly

Anyone who has been through grade school knows kids tend not to take too kindly to those who may be a bit different. For Matthew, every opportunity to connect with others came with a fear of embarrassment. So he turned away from people.

"Before, when I was younger, I couldn't really go up to anyone because I was scared of stuttering," he says. "Bowling helped me learn that it's alright to approach people, even if I stutter, and I learned that once I got used to people, my stuttering stopped."


"I think bowling actually helped me get more out there as a person, because I used to be really shy until I started bowling. And now, I am kind of more out there and I am able to talk to people and actually go walk up to them. And I had people actually coming up to me to talk to me rather than me going up to them. That's how I started coming out of my shell.

The place where Matthew came out of his shell is a Fort Worth bowling center called Cityview Lanes, where Collen Gore works as Youth Director and has coached Matthew for years.

"Bowling really helped Matthew with social skills, because he was very introverted and selfconscious about his speech impediment," Gore says. "That's what it's about, seeing these bowlers come in very young and inexperienced - not only in bowling, but in life -and helping them not just with their bowling skills, but with their growth as people."

"The other youth bowlers at my center opened their arms and accepted Matthew as he was. Never once have I heard anyone say anything about his speech impediment."

Those other youth bowlers who opened their arms to Matthew also opened his eyes to possibilities beyond his Saturday morning youth league, possibilities that led him to a tournament in Houston last month. Bowling may have helped Matthew find his confidence off the lanes, but down in Houston, it was his confidence on the lanes that stole the show. Matthew bowled his first 300 game.

"I was very proud," says Justin Beimler, 21, who bowled with Matthew in a travel league for years and has been his mentor in the sport. "From where he came from, to where he is today, I mean, it's a huge improvement for him. And it just shows that with a little help and a lot of determination you can do anything.

For most kids, bowling that first 300 game is the moment they prove to themselves that they could do it. But for Matthew, it also was another way of proving to himself that he wasn't afraid.

"You're up on the approach and you're alone up there, and you know you have all these people staring at you when you're making your shot," Matthew says. "And you know you can make it or break it '

Matthew made it that day in Houston, just as he has made it from the shy kid who showed up at the center with his grandma one hot Texas day into the young man he has become.

"Collen has watched him become a young man through bowling," says Matthew's mother, Tammy. "He just fell in with a good group of people at the bowling center and he got comfortable around them. He didn't care if he started stuttering and, by the time he got to ninth grade, he was taken out of speech therapy because he no longer needed it."



As a member of 2011 Junior Team USA, she won a team gold medal in the Pan American Bowling Confederation Youth Championships (PABCON) and earned four gold medals in the 2011 Tournament of the Americas.

In addition to her bowling accomplishments, she has won numerous academic awards including a berth on the NCAA Academic All-America first team and as a member of the Northeast Conference Academic Honor Roll

The \$1,000 Billy Welu Scholarship is awarded annually in honor of the PBA Charter Member who won the BPAA All Star in 1959 before winning the 1964 and '65 USBC Masters events. He was PBA President for two years, a member of the PBA Tournament Committee for eight years and served for 16 years on the Executive Board. Welu, who also was a color analyst on early PBA Tour telecasts, was inducted into both the PBA and USBC Halls of Fame in 1975.

Collegiate News

Bowling Combine Tests Potential Collegiate Bowlers



More than 20 college coaches were on hand to watch 48 girls and 60 boys were run through a series of tests at the ITRC

More than 100 student-athletes had the opportunity for their skills to be evaluated and to meet with college coaches during the four-day Bowling Combine for College Prospects, which wrapped up Friday at the International Training and Research Center in Arlington.

The 48 girls and 60 boys who participated in this year's Bowling Combine were run through a series of tests at the ITRC, the official training center of Team USA. The Team USA coaching staff evaluated the bowlers using state-of-the-art ball motion technology,

video analysis and more.

More than 20 college coaches were on hand to watch the participants go through the drills and talk with potential prospects to see if the student-athletes might fit their programs.

Kristina Frahm (pictured left), who became head coach at the University of Maryland Eastern Shore last season and led her team to the NCAA Women's Bowling title, is recruiting for the first time. She said events such as the Bowling Combine and the North Pointe Junior Gold Championships allow her the opportunity to see young bowlers committed to the sport.

"It shows who has the love for the game, and that's a big key to recruiting – who is willing to go out for these

two long days of bowling," Frahm said. "Here, they do both the athletic side as well as the bowling side, spare percentages and rotation and tilt ... all of that comes into play when you are looking for good bowlers."

The student-athletes, most starting their junior or senior years of high school, went through sport-specific tests that included spare shooting, release and speed ranges and



shot repeatability. Players rotated through five stations during spare shooting and had the chance to throw at least 15 shots to convert each spare as many times as possible.

"It is a very good opportunity for us."

said Rebecca Gomez, one of three participants from Costa Rica. "It was a great experience. They really put us to work. We had the chance to work and train like the big teams do. It was a great opportunity to test ourselves and for us to show what the bowling level of Costa Rica is."

Part of the testing process included time in the gym, where participants underwent a series of tests to determine their overall athleticism. Among the tests performed were the vertical jump, balance test, grip strength and a functional movement screen. They also took the "IT Factor" test that evaluates their Bowling IQ, common problem-solving skills and



provides a personality profile.

"I decided I want to pursue bowling after high school and through college, so I thought this would be good to attend," said David Whitson of Carlisle, Ky., who will be a high school senior this fall. "I didn't really understand that bowling is so high tech. Overall, this has been really good, although I wasn't really ready for a test."

Each athlete received a ranking called the Performance Evaluation Test (P.E.T.) score





at the end of the Bowling Combine. The score is an objective view of their overall abilities in key areas necessary for success and can be compared against the bowlers at this, previous or future combines.

Each bowler also received a Recruiting Kit that has video shots, bowler variables measured and a detailed report of personal data collected during the combine.

The Bowling Combine was developed to allow young bowlers to be evaluated using objective standards and to give college coaches a chance to analyze the potential fit of the student-athletes in their programs.

Team USA assistant coach Bryan d the ITRC staff of Team USA head

O'Keefe(left) is program director for the Combine and the ITRC staff of Team USA head coach Rod Ross, Team USA assistant head coach Kim Terrell-Kearney and USBC Sports Performance Specialist Nick Bohanan oversaw the testing.

Gordon Vadakin (below), head

coach of Wichita State, said he had multiple reasons to attend the Bowling Combine along with assistant coachMark Lewis. "It's always good to come to the ITRC to see what is going on with the technology; that's always a plus," Vadakin said.

"It's beneficial to see what they are working on, and how they are evaluating the kids. And we are here for recruiting; that's probably the primary thing but there are other goals that are being accomplished. But we're trying to see if there is someone who might be able to fill a hole a year from now or two years from now."



July 2012 Kegel Bowler Of The Month

ARLINGTON, Texas - Marshall Kent, of Yakima, Washington, has been named the July 2012 Kegel Bowler of the Month by the Bowling Writers Association of America

Kent won medals at the 12th World Youth Bowling Championships in Thailand. His two gold medals came in Boy's

Team (with Team USA teammates Andrew Koff, Zack Hattori, and Chris Via), Boy's Singles, two silver medals in Boy's Doubles (with Team USA teammate Andrew Koff) and Boy's All-Events, and a bronze medal in the Boy's Masters divisions.

Team USA defeated Team Singapore for the gold medal 889-807. Kent then downed Team Japan's Shusaku Asato for the Boy's Singles gold, 226-197. The silver medals came in a 480-402 loss to Team South Korea's Kim Yeon-Sang and Hwang Dong-Jun and placing only 9 pins behind gold medalist Sam Cooley of Team Australia in Boy's All-Events. His bronze medal came in a Boy's Masters 242-202 semifinal loss to the eventual gold medalist Daniel Fransson of Team Sweden.

Kent, a junior at Robert Morris-Illinois, first won Bowler of the Month honors in July 2010 after winning two premier youth scholarship events in the United States, the USBC Junior Gold Championships and the North Pointe Insurance High School Open Championships.

Others receiving votes were Robyn Renslow, the U20 Girls gold medalist and AJ Johnson, the U20 Boys gold medalist at the North Pointe Junior Gold Championships presented by Brunswick; and Osku Palermaa, winner of the 34th European Bowling Tour (EBT) Trofeu Internacional Ciutat de Barcelona.
