

## Latvia's Zavjalova Wins 2013 USBC Queens

**HENDERSON, Nev.** - Latvia's Diana Zavjalova became the first foreign player in more than two decades to win the United States Bowling Congress Queens as she defeated USBC Hall of Famer Leanne Hulsenberg of North Ogden, Utah, 190-160, at Sunset Station's Strike Zone Bowling Center on Thursday night.

The 22-year-old right-hander was the first No. 1 seed since 2009 to secure the title, and she did so in her first USBC Queens appearance. Hall of famer Carol Gianotti of Australia was the last foreign player to claim the coveted crown, doing so in 1989, two years before Zavjalova was born. The televised finals will air on ESPN2 on Sunday at 2:30 p.m. EDT.

"There are just so many feelings right now, but excitement is at the top of the list," said Zavjalova, who earned \$20,000 and the traditional Queens tiara. "This is the first time I have bowled in this event, I was the leader and I was able to beat a hall of famer. I'm living my dream. I just can't believe it."

Zavjalova has been successful under the television lights before, helping Webber International to the women's title at the 2012 USBC Intercollegiate Team Championships, but the experience is much different when you're out there alone.

Despite being nervous, Zavjalova felt confident with her first few shots, though the 10 pin didn't agree. After missing one in the second frame, she was able to refocus, and the pins started to cooperate.

"I was mad on the inside, but I knew I had to let it go," said Zavjalova, who struck in the sixth, seventh and eighth frames to put the game out of reach. "I started fresh after the open, and even though I left another 10 pin, I made it and kept trying to throw good shots."

Hulsenberg, who has made more than 100 television appearances in her career, threw 15 strikes in

her first two matches but was plagued with poor carry in the finale. The 1999 Queens champion missed two single-pin spares late in the game to ultimately cost her a chance at becoming the ninth bowler in history with two Queens victories. She took home \$10,000 for the runner-up finish Thursday.

In the semifinal, Hulsenberg struck eight times as she defeated Shayna Ng of Singapore, 249-172. Ng, who was never lower than second in the standings all week, left splits in the fourth and fifth frames and wasn't able to recover.

Hulsenberg started her first game on TV since winning the 2011 Bowling's U.S. Women's Open at Cowboys Stadium in Arlington, Texas, with a missed 7 pin before getting comfortable. She then rattled off a string of five strikes to build a 30-pin lead over Jennifer Higgins of Westerville, Ohio, and advanced to the semifinal with a 235-184 win.

In the evening's opening match, Higgins trailed after six frames but made a late charge with three consecutive strikes and cruised past USBC Hall of Famer and two-time Queens champion Lynda Barnes of Double Oak, Texas, 205-173.

The Queens is open to any female USBC member, and with this year's event coming just after the World Tenpin Bowling Association World Championships, the field included 202 players representing 15 countries.

Other international Queens winners include Kazue Inahashi of Tokyo in 1984 and Katsuko Sugimoto, also from Tokyo, in 1981 and 1982.

## Bob Markiewicz

Becomes Good Samaritan On Way Home  
From PBA50 Tour

A funny thing happened to PBA member Bob Markiewicz on his way back home to San Diego after finishing out the PBA50 Tour season in Welch, Minn.

He turned into a Good Samaritan and may be the driving force in saving a small-town's bowling center from extinction.

For bowling fans who don't know Markiewicz by name or face, you likely have been impacted by his role in the sport. He the founder of InteGreat Software, the company that designed the Brackman software used around the world to manage brackets at bowling tournaments.

Markiewicz also is an accomplished bowler who had held PBA membership for several years before illness forced him into temporary retirement. He recently decided to kick-start his game, at age 51, and after bowling the final PBA50 Tour events of the year, decided to re-join the PBA.

Following the Treasure Island Resort & Casino Open, he decided to visit his sister (Pam Spidah) in Devil Lake, N.D., before returning home to San Diego.

It was only about a six-hour drive from Minnesota, Markiewicz said, but when I got to Devil Lake, I learned there is a 16-lane bowling center (Royal Lanes) that is in danger of closing. The proprietor (Jim Mellon) basically said if business doesn't improve this year, he is going to close the center.

This town has really inspired me he added. This got me thinking about a lot of things in my life, and a cause like this just grabs you.

Markiewicz decided to do what he could to help rescue the center, which had seen its adult league-bowler base shrink from 730 men and women in 2006 to 191 adults last season. Even worse, Royal Lanes youth program only included 18 kids. Markiewicz talked to the owner and offered to lend a hand.

I helped organize a \$1-a-game promotion a couple of weeks ago, they had 120 people including the first waiting list the center had seen in years. It goes to show what you can do in a small town if you promote things, he said. In small towns, everyone knows everyone, so word gets around if you know how to do it.

Taking on a challenge like trying to help save a failing bowling center is something Markiewicz understands. He was the lead programmer for a software company in San Diego, but got laid off. So using his skills and his passions for bowling, he started his own company – InteGreat Software.

One door closed, another opened, he said. In his newly re-discovered role as a PBA member, he is trying to use that status to rebuild the grassroots league bowling base in Devil Lake.

Every once in a while, as a professional, your given an opportunity others don't have to influence people, he added, but you have to have the desire to step forward. People can say the same thing I say, but because they aren't professionals, people don't listen the same way. Its an opportunity some people don't know how to handle, but it is something they can use if they choose to use it in a constructive way. I can honestly say the work I've done in Devils Lake has made me feel better than anything else I have ever done in bowling.

## International Field For World Series Grows to 19 Countries

With new entries from Saudi Arabia and Bahrain, a field of 46 international players from a record 19 countries will compete in the PBA World Series of Bowling V when its gets underway Oct. 25 at **South Point Bowling Center in Las Vegas**.

With roughly six weeks to go, there were fewer than 50 spots available for the 240-player World Series field. PBA members will compete for five titles in Las Vegas: the Cheetah, Chameleon, Scorpion and Viper Championships plus the PBA World Championship.

## Bowlmor-AMF Merger Causing Ripples

Since New York-based Bowlmor took over AMF [Bowling Worldwide, Inc.](#) about two months ago, the acquiring company has been making its presence known. And not everyone is pleased with the results.

Locally, Georgett Studnicka, the two-time president of the Monday morning Christmas Club league at [AMF Woodlake Lanes](#) in Woodland Hills, reported Thursday that many daytime league bowlers at the center are "shocked and sad" at the closing of several Woodlake leagues.

"About 100 to 150 women [bowlers] are being displaced," said Studnicka, a Chatsworth resident. "Some are going to [Corbin Bowl](#) [in Tarzana]. Others are just retiring."

Studnicka, who is in her 70s, bowls in both the Christmas Club and Wednesday morning Troublemakers leagues. The Troublemakers league has about 50 members and is believed to have existed for more than 40 years. The Troublemakers players bowled their last games in that league Wednesday; many of them are moving on to Corbin.

Studnicka said Troublemakers members were recently told that its fall season would start Sept. 4. A few days later, members were notified that there would be no league bowling in the morning, Studnicka said.

Studnicka said the 12-person Christmas Club league is scheduled to finish its season in December and expects the league will not continue. Woodlake Bowl's Fall Follies league with its some 50 bowlers also will not be continuing.

Kay Fountain, the secretary for the Christmas Club and Troublemakers leagues, said "the people who are coming in from New York think the economy in this end of the Valley is great."

As a result, Fountain said she expected Woodlake Lanes was trying to create a "party center for young adults for the 20-30 crowd."

Bob Edwards, the general manager of Woodlake Lanes, said "the new boss felt our daytime bowling was

not paying off because of the operating costs of the business and made a decision to open at 4 [p.m.] and save hundreds and hundreds of dollars in payroll."

Edwards said the decision to end several leagues was difficult for him because "I know a lot of the ladies a long time. It was one of the toughest things I had to do. It was nothing against the ladies. I called [other] bowling centers and asked them if they had room [for the discontinued leagues]."

"It's upsetting to me because [Woodlake] has been home to some of the women for 40 years," Edwards said. "It was a financial decision. The first thing I did was trying to find somewhere else for them to bowl." Edwards added: "The nighttime leagues are fine. We'll continue to operate from 4 until midnight."

The merger of Bowlmor and AMF has resulted in a new company called Bowlmor AMF. It is the largest operator of bowling centers in the world with 7,500 employees and 272 bowling centers.

Before the merger, Bowlmor operated with six bowling centers under the control of Tom Shannon, who is now the chief executive, chairman and president of Bowlmor AMF. None of Bowlmor's bowling houses had league play.

In an interview after the merger, Shannon said that Bowlmor was the "only bidder willing to pay" to help AMF out of bankruptcy. It was the second time in 10 years that AMF had been in bankruptcy.

"I didn't buy AMF to get in bankruptcy a third time, but to save it," Shannon had said in the July 9 interview.

In that interview, Shannon also declared that league bowling under the new company was "very safe."

"We plan to increase the league bowling business, not shrink it," Shannon had said. Shannon could not be reached for comment for this story.

## Tenth Tournament Breaks Records



The 10th New Mexico Open held last week at Tenpins & More was a record-breaker in many ways, including awarding the winner, Nathan Bohr his biggest first place check ever of \$ 10,120.

Bohr of Wichita, Kansas said as much after he beat top seed, Geoffrey Young of Denton, Texas 188-183 in a tense final that produced only eight strikes, ten spares and three open frames (splits).

In fact, Bohr's 2-10 split conversion in the third frame put added pressure on Young, who had moved up from ninth place earlier in the day to win poll position with a 256 closer to jump front-runners Bohr and Robert Gotchall of Nebraska in the position round.

Young struggled on the right lane after that, leaving a 2-8-10 and a brooklyn strike before finding a way in with strikes in the eighth and tenth frames. But it was too late as Bohr spared a single pin and got a 6-count to win by five.

The two newest members of next year's Team USA showed experience and versatility throughout the 29-game event played on testing lane conditions, prepared by former touring pro, Mike Miller. They were tabbed co-favorites for the title prior to the tournament.

In earlier championship round action, left-hander, Theo Douthit of Arizona, eliminated Kyle King of Arizona 258-225 and Gotchall 280-216 before falling to Bohr 235-212 in the semi-final, leaving a wash-out in the tenth frame when a turkey would have put him in the final against Young.

The New Mexico Open was acclaimed the most successful yet, with 213 entries from 16 states and one from Brisbane, Australia - up 40 on last year. The main event prize-fund was \$ 50,220, up \$ 8,570 over 2012.

In all, including the three pre-tournament sweepers, consolation, pro-am and brackets, the pay-out was \$ 65,793.

## TEAM USA'S BARNES, O'KEEFE WIN ALL-EVENTS

HENDERSON, Nev. - Team USA's Chris Barnes and Shannon O'Keefe earned the all-events gold medals Wednesday as team qualifying came to an end at the 2013 World Tenpin Bowling Association World Championships.

It was a completely different path to gold for each of them as Barnes dominated the field most of the week, while O'Keefe bolted from eighth to first the last game at Sunset Station's Strike Zone Bowling Center.

In the final game of team qualifying, O'Keefe fired a 269 game to not only help give Team USA the top seed in the women's team semifinals but also boost her into the all-events gold.

O'Keefe finished her 24-game total with 5,209 (217.04 average), while Korea's Son Yun-Hee earned the silver with 5,189. Latvia's Diana Zavjalova took the bronze with 5,166.

"I never looked at the scores for all-events the last game and didn't have any idea until we were completely done," O'Keefe said. "I had no idea because I was so focused on helping get the team into first place and knock down as many pins as we could."

The team USA women entered the second round of team qualifying in eighth place and put together games of 1,074, 1,191 and 1,226 to surge into the top spot with 6,439 (214.63 average). Malaysia earned the second seed with 6,277, Korea was third with 6,262 and Venezuela was fourth with 6,211.

In the semifinals Thursday night, Team USA will face Venezuela, while Malaysia will battle Korea. The winners will meet for the gold medal Friday.

On the men's side, Barnes totally dominated the all-events standings, winning the gold medal by 210 pins with 5,609 (233.71 average). Korea's Cho Young-Seon took the silver with 5,399 and Team USA's Bill O'Neill earned bronze with 5,370.

"It's not very often that you can get that far ahead of a very talented field," Barnes said. "My ball reaction played a huge part in the win as well as the guys I bowled with."

The Team USA men settled for the second seed in the men's semifinals after Barnes left a pocket 7-10 split in the final frame allowing Korea to earn the top seed by just four pins.

The Koreans finished on top of the standings with 6,560 (218.67 average), while Team USA was second with 6,556. Denmark finished third with 6,512, and Finland was fourth with 6,500.

Korea will face Finland, while Team USA will take on Denmark in the semifinals Thursday night. The winners will meet for the gold medal Friday.

The top 24 players in the all-events standings after 24 games advanced to the Masters competition, which gets underway with the first round Thursday morning.

The advancing players will bowl six additional games with all pins carrying forward to determine the top eight for round-robin match play.

After seven games of round robin, the top four men

and top four women will advance to the semifinals, which will take place Friday morning.

All rounds of the World Championships are being broadcast live on BOWL.com's BowlTV.

## Husband & Wife Claim Masters Gold for Korea

HENDERSON, Nev. - Bowling has seen its share of love connections on the lanes, but Korea's Cho Young-Seon and Son Yun-Hee raised the bar for bowling families everywhere when they became the first husband and wife to claim Masters gold medals at the World Tenpin Bowling Association World Championships.

There's no doubt that competing on the biggest stage in international bowling can be intimidating, but the two were able to find comfort in making the 6,000-mile journey to Las Vegas together, and the trip culminated with an emotional moment atop the medal stand Friday at Sunset Station's Strike Zone Bowling Center.

Both Cho and Son enjoyed success on the lanes this week, including a pair of silver medals in all-events, but sometimes, the best stories and memories go beyond leader boards.

"I just cannot easily express how incredible this feels," Cho said. "We knew after she won there was a chance to do something special."

Son earned her gold medal with a 211-193 win against her Korean teammate Kim Moon-Jeong, while Cho topped all-events winner Chris Barnes of Team USA, 254-195.

The 2013 WTBA World Championships marked the first time since 2003 that the men's and women's events have been held in the same venue. For the last decade, the World Championships have been held every two years, alternating between the men and women.

# SINGAPORE'S NG LEADS AFTER TWO ROUNDS AT 2013 USBC QUEENS



**HENDERSON, Nev.** - Singapore's Shayna Ng quickly is making a name for herself on the international bowling scene, and after two consistent days at Sunset Station's Strike Zone Bowling Center, her name is atop the standings at the 2013 United States Bowling Congress Queens presented by Storm.

The 23-year-old right-hander shot 289 in her final qualifying game Monday to set the pace for the 67 players who advanced to the cashers round, which will begin Tuesday at noon EDT live on BOWL.com's BowlTV.

Ng started the day in second place with 1,206 and added 1,149 to finish qualifying with a 10-game total of 2,355, a 235.5 average. Lindsay Boomershine of Brigham City, Utah, is second with 2,298 and Team USA member Shannon O'Keefe of Arlington, Texas, is third with 2,284. It took a score of 2,021 to reach the cashers round.

"The Queens is a pretty prestigious event, so doing well means a lot, but it's still so early in the tournament," Ng said. "Even though I'm the leader now, there are many more rounds to go, and anything can happen. I am going to take baby steps from here and focus on one round at a time."

Ng has been in the Las Vegas area for nearly three weeks, and her stellar performance at the USBC Queens is coming after a disappointing run for her and her teammates at the recent 2013 World Tenpin Bowling Association World Championships.

The group will be well-represented on the lanes Tuesday, however, as seven of the eight Queens entrants from Singapore advanced to the third round. Geraldine Ng is ninth, followed by Wichita State star Jazreel Tan (13th), Daphne Tan (36th), Cherie Tan (T40th), Bernice Lim (42nd) and 2008 QubicaAMF World Cup champion Jasmine Yeong-Nathan (58th).

"Coming right from a tournament that was as challenging as the World Championships helped us, and we're really just trying to prove ourselves at the Queens," said Ng, whose breakout year includes a win at the 2012 World Cup and a victory over two-time Queens winner Kelly Kulick at the 2013 International Bowling Championships supported by DHC, a World Bowling Tour major. "The Queens pattern seems to be a little more forgiving, and I've been able to match up well thanks to the right equipment and a good range of balls in my arsenal."

All 67 cashers will bowl an additional five games

Tuesday morning, and the top 63 competitors after 15 games will join defending champion Diandra Asbaty of Chicago for double-elimination match-play, which will begin Tuesday at 5 p.m. EDT. Asbaty finished the day tied for 37th place with 2,093. Should she not qualify for match play, she automatically will earn the 64th seed.

Match play will continue Wednesday, and the final five players will advance to the televised stepladder finals, which will be taped Sept. 5 at 10 p.m. EDT and air on ESPN2 on Sept. 8 at 2:30 p.m. Eastern. The winner will take home the \$20,000 top prize, and a perfect game in the championship match will earn the player an additional \$10,000 from Storm Bowling Products.

The Queens is open to any female USBC member, and with this year's event coming just after the WTBA World Championships, the field included 202 players representing 15 countries.

Competitors at this year's Queens also have another opportunity to cash in through the USBC Shoot-Out, a special event following Queens qualifying with a \$4,000 prize fund.

Four players will advance to the Shoot-Out based on qualifying scores with the high player from each of the following categories earning spots: international players, collegiate/youth players, players who have not competed in the Queens in the past four years and all others. Tournament rules will dictate the category in which each player competes.



## Idle Bowling Thoughts

There have been many bowling institutions in bowling. Some are as short lived as a small candle in a large wind. Others are as long lasting as a mountain reaching into the sky.

One of the rocks of bowling was John Jowdy, who left us all too soon, though he had a long and successful earthly stay of 93 years.

In my earlier days in bowling I made it a point to attend every meeting, tournament or gathering of the sport--- and there was one common plus---John Jowdy was there.

We hit it off from the start, whether we agreed or agreed not to agree, friends, buddies, we were close to brothers. Some people called him a bowling ball salesman and a few claimed he couldn't make the judgment calls he never shied away from.

That irked me and because as a pioneer of the sport, able and willing to study and try to understand every aspect of bowling, John was a valued public relations master and executive for his beloved Columbia. He loved our sport, warts and all.

We went to places where we were not fully welcome and we listened to almost everyone. The most important thing I learned about Jowdy is that first and foremost he was a people person with an inquiring mind that never learning and loving in his own way.

John's life experiences included operating a nightclub and his sports connection was as a top softball pitcher and of course a fine bowler who made the finer points of our game available to the world. He had a way with words, both spoken and written and was never afraid to do research and gain knowledge from others.

Over the years I discovered he was an excellent dancer with feathery movements, a classy dresser with a flair for color, ties, cowboy hats and boots.

Jowdy hats were the best and he owned boots made of almost every exotic leather used for that purpose. I still have a huge collection of various era ties that he'd given me from his bulging clothing closet.

Over the years I had the pleasure of rolling with such great doubles partners as Lou Campi, Lindy Faragalli, Craz Castellano and even the one and only Andy Varipapa, all multiple Hall of Famers.

When my four sons became good enough we decided to go to the American Bowling Congress Tourney as a team but we needed a bowler for doubles and singles and John became my honorary son and doubles partner. We couldn't roll more than a few frames without someone dropping by to chat with Jowdy.

He wasn't a magnet but he did have a special attraction to all who knew and respected him as wide and inspiring as you can imagine.

Our original writers group at breakfast were Jowdy, Dick Evans and Joe Lyou, all now passed, and they let me in too. There was kidding, needling and both idle and serious chatter amongst us. Soon bowlers in the top tournaments joined the group, the all time greats such as Dick Weber and Johnny Petraglia at the Firestone Tournament of Champions and often our group ballooned to 40 or more bowlers, writers and officials.

Jowdy always had a way with the ladies because he treated them like ladies, never failing to send a hand written "thank you" note to tournament workers, scorers and others involved in the tourney in some way.

John's birthday always came during the Firestone and whether we did it or not we celebrated with a cake. However one time the competing bowlers came up with a surprise for John to thank him for the uncountable hours he spent teaching almost everyone who asked.

I had to keep him busy once while the hotel site was being prepared for the fete and that event brought the usually talkative John close to tears when he was presented with a gold watch.

"I considered that birthday party one of the highlights of my life because so many of you went out of your way to say thank you in such a unique way in such a once in a lifetime setting." Fondly recalled.

Jowdy will be remembered as one of the greatest bowling teachers of all time, from youngsters in his home town of San Antonio, Texas to more than a hundred top stars, including the world's outstanding pro champions.

The John Jowdy scholarship and many of his innovations are standard in bowling circles and the bowling world is all the better for his being.

We could write his name in smoke in the sky, but the wind would wash it away. So let's just keep him in a loving corner of our hearts---where it will stay---for all the forever's and a day.

## Helen Duval's Bowling Tips

### Keep Your Arm Close to Your Body

Have you any idea where your ball is in the swing and release at the foul line? Are you able to roll the ball over your selected arrow (point of aim) but it still misses your strike pocket either to the left or right?

When you approach the foul line to deliver your ball, you should be balanced well enough to be able to stay there until the ball crosses your arrow or spot and hits the pins. Your foot should be straight toward the target, knee bent, shoulders parallel to the target and square to the sliding foot, foot and leg under the body for support and balance, eyes on the target, fingers still slightly curled from the release and lifting (arm and hand reaching out and up in the finish of the follow-through).

Before you read further, get yourself into this position and you will see how comfortable it is and that you can stay there.

If you were to draw a line from your curled fingers down to the foul line, you would arrive at the same board that is directly under the center of the ball. If you were to measure the distance between the center of the ball and your sliding foot, you'd find it was seven inches.

What I am saying is that if you keep your arm swing close to your body during your approach, slide your foot straight ahead, lean over the foul line toward your target, follow through toward your target, all this will happen. You will find that you can hit your given target without pulling the ball and that it will be easier to get to your strike pocket.

Of course, this theory applies to your spares also; you must try to be square or parallel to all targets.

Watch good, steady bowlers and you will see them release the ball close by their sliding foot, thereby being able to stay in balance at the foul line. If you can trust someone to tell you where your arm swing is in relationship to your body, listen to them. Maybe that will help you swing the ball in a straight line.

Remember: Be square and stay parallel to your target.



## Free Agency Begins... and Ends with All PBA League Rosters Filled

### ALL PBA LEAGUE TEAMS FILL PRE-DRAFT ROSTERS AS FREE AGENCY BEGINS...AND ENDS

Following a couple of key strategic signing moves in the final hours of the re-signing period on Aug. 31, PBA League “free agency” opened with a flurry of activity on Sunday, Sept. 1, and ended almost as quickly as it started. As the Labor Day weekend came to a close, all eight PBA League teams had filled their pre-draft rosters with the league maximum of four signed players.

All team rosters with compensation values are listed below. Each team will have one additional roster slot to fill during the 2014 PBA League Draft, which will be held at South Point Bowling Center in Las Vegas at the conclusion of the World Series of Bowling, and webcast live on PBA's exclusive online bowling channel, Xtra Frame.

The player draft will be held in reverse order of how teams finished during the PBA League's inaugural season: No. 8 Pittsburgh Jack Rabbits will draft first, followed by the Philadelphia Hitmen, Silver Lake Atom Splitters, L.A. X, BROOKLYN STyLES, Dallas Strikers, Motown Muscle and the defending Elias Cup champion New York City WTT KingPins.

In the final hours of re-signing on Aug. 31, Dallas Strikers player/manager Norm Duke brought back Mike Machuga to his No. 3 roster slot and retained

PBA Hall of Famer Amleto Monacelli as his No. 4 player. Moments later, L.A. X manager Andrew Cain re-signed PBA Hall of Famer Parker Bohn III to his No. 3 roster slot.

As free agency began on Sept. 1, Silver Lake Atom Splitters manager Mark Baker quickly signed former L.A. X player Wes Malott to his No. 2 roster position and shortly thereafter landed Tommy Jones as his No. 3 player. Jones, a member of the defending champion New York City WTT Kingpins, filled the final opening on Silver Lake's pre-draft roster.

On the heels of Silver Lake's moves, L.A. X brought in ex-Philadelphia Hitmen star Mika Koivuniemi in the No. 2 slot, filling its pre-draft roster.

Motown Muscle manager Del Ballard Jr. was next, landing ex-Hitmen star Chris Loschetter as his No. 2 player and ex-BROOKLYN STyLES team member Ryan Shafer was signed to complete the Muscle's pre-draft roster in the No. 3 roster slot.

NYC WTT KingPins' manager Carolyn Dorin-Ballard added her fourth pre-draft player, England's Stuart Williams in the team's No. 3 slot. Williams bowled for the Atom Splitters last season.

Pittsburgh Jack Rabbits manager Tim Mack landed ex-Motown player Ronnie Russell in his No. 2 slot and re-signed Sweden's Martin Larsen in his No. 4 slot to fill his roster.

Philadelphia Hitmen manager Jason Couch made his final two moves, landing ex-STyLES No. 2 player Ryan Ciminelli in the same slot and ex-Jack Rabbit Dan MacLelland as his No. 3 player, also filling the same slot he held with Pittsburgh last season.

BROOKLYN STyLES manager Johnny Petraglia put his fourth player in place, landing ex-Muscle No. 2 player Tom Smallwood as his team's No. 4 player for 2014.

## RECAPPING THE 2014 PBA LEAGUE ROSTER RULES

To recap activities to this point, team managers had until Aug. 31 to re-sign up to three players (in addition to the No. 1 player, who is automatic) from last year's rosters, and assign them to slot positions on their 2014 rosters – from No. 2 through No. 5.

Slot positions involve pre-set compensation ranges, starting at an automatic \$20,000 for the No. 1 player (formerly known as the franchise player). Team managers have a total cap of \$71,000 within which they can negotiate player compensation. For No. 2 slots, players must be paid between \$14,000-18,000. For No. 3 slots, the payment range is between \$12,000-16,000. For No. 4 players, the range is \$10,000-14,000. For No. 5 slot positions, the range is \$8,000-12,000.

Existing rostered players who were unsigned as of Aug. 31 were eligible to negotiate with other teams between Sept. 1 and Oct. 1. No team is allowed to sign more than four players, assuring that each team will have at least one open position for the draft.

The PBA League draft will include any unsigned free agents as well as any player from the top 50 on the 2012-13 PBA competition points list who elects to enter the 2014 draft. Teams for 2014 will consist of five rostered players only; there will not be “supplemental” players next season.

Special rules will apply in the case of injuries, illness, etc. All PBA League roster transactions must be approved by PBA Commissioner Tom Clark.





## ASK BOB

By: Bob Korth

Q. I have been asked to help with a senior bowling class. Do you have any hints on helping seniors?

A. Being a senior myself I think I have some idea's on the subject. Plus I have instructed seniors from time to time. First you have to remember with seniors you must first ask them about any physical conditions like that really can affect the things they might be able to do. Such as arthritis or joint replacement, Knees or hips. You have to work with what they have physically. I just coached a group of 6 ladies aged 77 to 83 they had slow speed and not much fluidity. Mostly I had them work on keeping there eyes on the target till the ball rolls through it to help with accuracy then on the proper place to line up for spares. With most seniors to get the best out of their game helping with the alignment for spares will get them the most improvement. Then checking the ball for weight and drilling will be the next thing to look at. Many are using the wrong weight ball and spans and pitches need correction. For you seniors out there that may be having problems with sore

fingers and wrists and hands go to your local pro shop and get your ball checked both for weight and for drilling. Bowling is supposed to be fun not torture. Lessons are also good for you to be able to get the most out of your physical game no matter what problems you may have. When there's a will there's a way.

Q. I am just starting to bowl again after a five year layoff. I have always used a 15 pound ball and quit because of a sore wrist. So I am thinking about going down to a 14 pound ball. Do you think the do you think the lower weight will hurt my scoring?

A. I doubt that your scores will go down much. The bowling balls today are very powerful. You might notice a few weight related ten pins but the lower weight should take some pressure off the wrist. So bowling pain free and with more control plus some added speed should make up any difference the occasional extra ten you might leave.

Q. When I bowl I target at the second arrow or close to that. I have heard that looking down the lane will keep the ball from hooking early. Is this true?

A. Targeting down the lane can help early hook. Sometimes though you might want the ball to hook a little earlier. What I do when warming up for league or tournament is start by targeting about ten feet past the arrows pick a dark or light board on the line you want to use say the ten board or 2<sup>nd</sup>. Arrow. If the ball goes high look further down toward the pins say 40 to 45 feet. Some lanes have tracer marks down there. If they do target there. If the ball goes light and you think you need earlier roll then target at the arrows. My name for this is the 3 spot system. Arrows, mid lane area, or 40 to 45 foot are or tracer board area. This works great for small lane adjustments when a larger move is not called for.

*Vietnamese Refugee Claims California Lucky for Life Ticket*


*Worth \$3.25 Million!*

## Junior Gold Has Record-Setting Year

ARLINGTON, Texas - For the third consecutive year, the North Pointe Junior Gold Championships established a record for number of participants and the Junior Gold program also set a membership record for the 2012-2013 season.

For the first time in tournament history, the North Pointe Junior Gold Championships, presented by Track, Columbia 300, Ebonite and Hammer, broke the 2,000-participant mark as 2,080 United States Bowling Congress Youth bowlers took to the lanes in Detroit in 2013, an 8-percent increase over last year's total.

The tournament added an Under 15 division in 2012 and that division experienced tremendous growth in 2013. The U15 Boys division grew by 101 bowlers, from 213 to 314, while the U15 Girls division drew 169 participants after having 99 the previous year.

The North Pointe Junior Gold Championships, along with the Survivor Tournament presented by xbowling, had a \$300,000 scholarship pool this year. It is the most scholarships awarded in tournament history.

"The addition of the U15 division, and the opportunity to earn scholarship awards and possibly a spot on Junior Team USA, has made the North Pointe Junior Gold Championships the premier national singles event for youth bowlers," Chad Murphy, International Bowling Campus Managing Director of Youth Development, said. "Many people, from Junior Gold tournament and league coordinators, to the bowling centers and youth coaches, can take pride in helping push this tournament to new levels of participation. Our sponsors also have been an integral part of making these events tremendously successful."

The program also set several records in 2013. A record 4,376 youth bowlers were Junior Gold members, a 9-percent increase over 2012, and the program saw 507 bowling centers play host to 1,070 Junior Gold competitions - both records.

The first Junior Gold tournament, called the USA Junior Gold National Bowling Championships, was held in 1998 at the National Bowling Stadium in Reno, Nev., and drew 538 participants.

The North Pointe Junior Gold Championships was created when the Bowling Proprietors' of America North Pointe High School Championships and the USBC Junior Gold Championships were merged into one national singles championship event with four divisions - U20 boys, U20 girls, U15 boys, U15 girls. The first North Pointe Junior Gold Championships took place in 2012.

The 2014 North Pointe Junior Gold Championships, scheduled for July 12-18 in Buffalo, N.Y., will see the addition of an Under 12 division.
