Barbara McBride

Several months ago, as Secretary of the Friendly Bunch League, I went to the Control Desk to pay the league fees and met for the very first time a new employee of the Bowl. My initial reaction was, 'Well, here's a new person – I wonder if she knows how to take the money and separate the lineage from the deposit?' I need not have worried as she most efficiently handled the transaction and gave me my receipt.

Since that day, I have been pleased to get to know her. Barbara McBride is a valued employee of the Bowl and has become appreciated by the bowlers of AMF Pinole Valley Lanes. Barbara was born at Hamilton Air Force Base in San Rafael during the time her Army Father was stationed at Two Rock Ranch in Petaluma. During her childhood years, the family moved quite a bit. Most of her elementary, middle and high school years were in Virginia. She graduated from Fauguier High School in Warrington, Virginia in 1966. The summer after graduation, she moved to California to live with a friend and started at Riverside City College in Riverside, CA. Barbara received an AA degree from there. The next summer she married and in 1969 had her daughter, Dyan, who now lives in Vallejo and is a teacher at U.C. Davis as well as being an actress and director mostly in musical theater, mainly in San Francisco.

In 1973, after a divorce and hard work as a single parent, Barbara graduated from Cal State Los Angeles receiving a degree in Recreation Administration. She then worked 8 years for YMCA, starting as Program Director and where, in time, she became Executive Director. Her next employment was for 8 years as a Probation Officer for Juvenile Probation in Riverside. Subsequently she had a small fund raising company which saw her traveling all over the U.S. During this time she remarried and became a mother once again. Her son, Robert, currently resides in North Carolina. Again divorced, Barbara lives with her daughter but is looking forward to renting a place of her own. How about her bowling history? California State Senior Association Meeting

On the weekend of March 7th and 8th, the California State Senior Association met for their mid-winter meeting. Attending from Pinole were AMF Pinole Valley Lanes bowlers Pat Brown as recording secretary and Robert Brown as Past President. The 2009 Senior's Tournament will be held again in Fresno. The decision to hold the 2010 Tournament also in Fresno came about because of the success of holding the tournament there for several years. The 2008 tournament was one team shy of having 400 teams which was quite an increase in participation over previous years. The original method of selecting the placement of this tournament was to alternate from north one year to south the next. Past history shows a decline in participation each succeeding year and a trial of having the tournament stay in the middle of the state was instituted. This tournament is open to all bowlers of 55 years and older and welcomes men teams, women teams, or mixed teams. A misconception by some seniors is this is a men's only tournament. Not so! So ladies, consider this a state tournament as much for you as for the men. Going into office were the following: D.C. Williams, President from Bakersfield, Al Hopson, First Vice President from Watsonville, Paul Ringler, Second Vice President from Torrance, and Vic Harris, Third Vice President from San Jose. Gina Moura from Antioch will manage the tournament starting in October and November.

USBC Open Tournament - Las Vegas, NV

The USBC National Open Tournament is now underway and runs from February 21st through July 23rd. Still remembered by many as ABC Tournament, this tournament got its new name several years ago when ABC (American Bowling Congress) and WIBC (Women's International Bowling Congress) merged. This prestigious tournament is open to all sanctioned adult bowlers. While there is a scratch division for the 'better' bowlers, lower average bowlers still have a chance to shine nationally as a handicapped format was instituted a few years ago. This handicapped division is designated as Classified and gives lower average bowlers a chance to win some of the prize fund. As previously stated for the California State Senior's, this also is a tournament where women can compete either as separate entities or as mixed team members. The format is Team Event, Doubles Event, and Singles Event. For those with computers, go to BOWL.com and see for yourself some videos which are there showing some of the action. While the 2009 Tournament may be a bit far for some to travel, a special two year hiatus will occur when the tournament is slated for Reno for years 2010 and 2011. It's not too early to think about this. In fact all Team Captains for the Las Vegas USBC Tournament have already received entry application forms for the 2010 Tournament. Soon, the forms will be available for others wishing to enter the tournament. Once a team competes, the following year's tournament forms are mailed to the team captain so he can get preferential dates. I personally am looking forward to the Las Vegas tournament as I will be receiving a plague for 25 years of participation. I have been to Syracuse, New York and Jacksonville, Florida and many places between those sites and California. Great memories for sure.
