thing we all need," Tom Nowatzke reflected as a legend of the game who played for the Lions and the Colts and took handoffs from Johnny Unitas.

Several other former NFL players concurred with the remarks of Nowatzke including Steeler Hall of Famer Lynn Swann who helped win four Super Bowls and former Cardinal Roger Wehrli.

Dr. Mitchell Checkvar who was the former head physician at University Community Hospital in Tampa says he knows first-hand about football injuries. "Helmets and equipment have improved over the years but there's only so much protection you can give to players from injuries in this roughest of sports," Checkvar said.

Another issue brewing in football is numerous lawsuits from parents and players on all levels from abuse of players including forcing them to play with concussions and other injuries and coaches employing practices where players hit each other without pads, helmets, or any other protection.

Walter Ray Williams Jr. won his second USBC Masters title and \$50,000 defeating top seed Chris Barnes 290-217 to mark his 47th victory and extending his record for the most in PBA Tour history while moving him up to a tie for second with Pete Weber and Mike Aulby who also have eight career major titles. All three players still trail Earl Anthony who won 10 majors and 43 total titles.

"This is just another little feather, it's just awesome," said Williams. "It's hard to explain it better than that. To win any tournament is awesome, and the bigger ones are even better. I really don't envision that I can get to 10, but I'm not giving up yet. I'm going to go out there and plug along as good as I can, and the year that I'm no longer exempt out here, that's when I will have had enough."

Williams got off to a shaky start against Barnes leaving a 7 pin but he was perfect after that finishing with 11 consecutive strikes.

"The last two Masters here in Reno I've gone undefeated in match play, I haven't lost a three-game match, yet I haven't won either tournament, said Barnes. "TV is one of the best things the sport has going for it, but it is probably the worst thing I have going for me personally."

To reach the championship match, Williams defeated No. 3 seed Ryan Ciminelli 258-224. Ciminelli advanced with a 246-229 victory over fourth seed Mike Scroggins in the opening match.

New Orleans Hornets Basketball All-Star point guard Chris Paul and Australia's two-handed star Jason Belmonte won the Chris Paul PBA Celebrity Invitational against Pittsburgh Steelers' Pro Bowl linebacker LaMarr Woodley and PBA Hall of Famer Norm Duke 180-177 in their come from behind win.

Last Fall when I was on a conference call with Chris Paul and BWAA bowling writers I suggested the idea to Chris to hold a tournament and he said it was a great concept and followed up on it.

The event was a cooperative venture between the PBA and Paul's CP3 Foundation which provides financial assistance to many organizations in his native Winston-Salem, NC and in New Orleans.

In the first semifinal round match, Paul and Belmonte beat Pete Weber and Grammy Award winning artist and actor Chris "Ludacris" Bridges 175-131.

In the next semifinal match, Duke and Woodley beat Wes Malott and fellow Pittsburgh Steelers star Hines Ward 165-149.

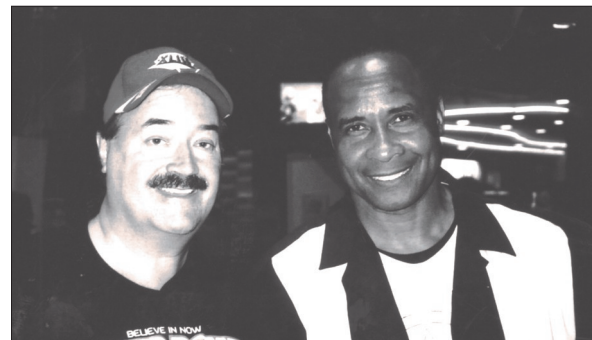
"We were bowling the Chris Paul Invitational for charity so the idea was to have fun," Belmonte said. "But I'm a competitive person and Chris is an extremely competitive person so we wanted to win. That was our strategy - have fun, but make sure we won and we did."

"To put Chris's name on the trophy was our goal from the beginning and we're happy to have
